

Deanslade Park: Protecting a historic landscape setting

Lichfield is a historic cathedral city set within rolling Staffordshire countryside. Like many UK cities, it needs to accommodate growth in order to remain lively and sustainable.

LDA Design helped secure release for new residential development of an area of the West Midland's green belt, on the southern edge of Lichfield. Success rested on our compelling vision for the site, which was adopted by Lichfield District Council as policy within its Local Plan and secured full planning consent.

Provision was made for Deanslade Park, a new 16.5ha green space on the rim of the Lichfield Bowl. The Park protects and enhances the rural setting of Lichfield and provides public access to the proposed Haresfield Prospect, offering fine views of the city and reinstating a famous early 18th century engraving of the city.

The proposals build on LDA Design's now built scheme for over 1,000 new properties on the south-west fringe of the city. At the heart of the scheme is 'Cathedral Walk', an avenue of trees and footpath leading to outstanding views of Lichfield's finest architectural asset, the only remaining medieval English cathedral with three spires.
